

already under way to restock this library every Spring and Fall for the clients of the center.






The Counseling Place has been serving the Richardson community for over 30 years by providing counseling for individuals, families, and couples. They offer various youth programs, which include Project Positive, a program which utilizes journals to strengthen emotional intelligence and coping skills, and an Alcohol Awareness program for minors. Victims of crime and traumatic events are also helped at The Counseling Place. It is estimated that this agency serves over 3,000 individuals and families every year. The work of the counseling team can get intense and very stressful. The agency's director, Deborah Dodds, mentioned to the Community Outreach Committee that she wished she had a way of saying thank you to her counselors during stressful experiences. To grant her request, Altrusa presented the director with a bouquet, which included over \$125 in gift cards. The Community Outreach Committee hopes that this gesture will show the counselors how much the Richardson community appreciates the work they do every day!

Donation to Safe Haven

The Crime Victim’s Rights Movement gained momentum in the 60’s and 70’s and the United Nations adopted a resolution in 1985 which established basic principles to protect victim’s rights. Since then, the City of Richardson, Richardson Police Department, and The Counseling Place have felt our community should establish programs that go above and beyond what is necessary by law to help victims of violence and crime. Safe Haven, a program which has come out of this effort, provides funds for temporary emergency lodging for victims of violence or crime.

This year, the Altrusa members of the Community Initiative Program have been collaborating with, Richardson’s Chief of Police, Jimmy Spivey, on how to best serve the needs of the Richardson community. It is for this reason the Community Outreach Committee has donated \$500 to the Richardson Police Department’s Safe Haven Program. Our donation will help enable community agencies to continue providing “safe” lodging to victims of violence or crime who are in imminent danger.


