She asked me who my emergency contact was since I live alone. I said, my daughter who lives close by. Does she have your emergency paperwork? No, but she knows where to find it in my office. Why not give her a copy so she doesn't have to come look for it in your house then run to the hospital?

And what if the pOaramedics come for you and you are not conscious? What do they need to know about you? Did you know paramedics are trained to look on the refrigerator for your emergency info? Really? No, I didn't know that.

so, here's a list of documents you should have on the fridge <u>and</u> in the hands of your emergency contacts. I think you should do it even if someone lives with you. You never know. And it would be good to take with you to all your doctors.

- Emergency contact(s). Name, phone #s and relationship
- 2. All medications, dosage, day/night, doctor who prescribed and phone number.
- 3. Any overarching conditions like diabetes, COPD, etc. Or metal implants or allergy to latex, etc.
- 4. Advance Directive
- 5 Medical Power of Attorney
- 6 Also, Cheryl suggested having a page with all doctors' business cards. It can help discern various specialties such as cardiologist or electrophysiology cardiologist, etc.


