Altrusa Grants Available to Area Nonprofits

Altrusa International of Richardson announces that applications are now being accepted for grants to qualifying area non-profits for the 2023-2024 grants cycle. Grants typically range from \$500 - \$1500. Monies provided by Altrusa grants must be used by awardees for specific projects benefitting the community and must be disbursed no later than May 31, 2024 unless otherwise reported.

A fillable application form and submission instructions are available on the Altrusa website at www.altrusarichardson.com/grants. Additionally, reminder letters are being sent to 501C-3 recipient organizations who received funding last year.

Submission deadline is August 31, 2023. Applications will be reviewed by the Grants Committee then its funding recommendations will be submitted to the Foundation which will make the awards. Grantees will receive notification by October 31, 2023.

- * Remember to take photos
- * Use Franklin Gothic Book font

Franklin Gothic Book Demi italic—12 pt. Topic

Franklin Gothic Book bold—14 pt. for Title

Franklin Gothic Book regular-12 pt. for Subject (subtitle)

Franklin Gothic Book regular—12 pt. for body of article.

Articles should be single line spaced aligned left. (See example below)

After the event: include project highlights and their impact on the community.

- * Upcoming events: send only who/what/when/where/why (instead of an "article").
- * If one committee person writes the article and another person does the picture, article <u>and</u> pictures should come in ONE email please, so nothing gets missed.
- ** PLEASE LABEL EACH PICTURE WITH WHAT THE OCCASION IS AND INCLUDE FULL NAMES OF EACH PER-SON IN THE PICTURE. Photo Release forms are on the website under Member Information and should be obtained if individual is not a member of Altrusa. Children's faces must not be shown without photo release.
- * PLEASE PUT THE WORD "TIDINGS" AND EVENT TITLE IN EMAIL SUBJECT LINE, to identify it and ensure it isn't missed in the many, many emails Bobbi receives!

Our newsletters are available online to the general public. Write articles with that in mind.

Submissions received after the 15th of the month will not be included in the Tidings for the current issue.
